Also a reminder to please clean the grills off with paper towels when you are finished using them.....The Legion sign now works electrically. We just need to position it..... Al Richar and Tom Bennet recently attended the National Commander Visitation dinner at Post 154 in Elmira Heights. They still feel the Post 770 puts out one of the best dinners in the district. I would have to agree with them.....Thank goodness elections are over, at least for now. The ads on TV, radio, newspapers, telephone calls, flyers, etc. were getting to be a little much. But, if that is the only price we must pay to live in a country which embraces a free society, then I guess its all worth it. Its great to be an American!.....We were very impressed with the Veteran's Parade in Ithaca this year. Because I can no longer march, my vantage point is Post 961, the VFW in Ithaca. It is always a nice get-to-gather with veteran friends from other Posts as well as some, including our Auxiliary President and family and others from Post 770. Accompanied by my son John and 3 year old grandson, Quinn, we enjoyed everything about the parade except that there were no marching units from Tompkins County. This is a first as far as I know. We were to have formed a single unit made up of our Tompkins County Posts but this didn't happen. A single red vehicle with a sign saying this represents Tompkins County, was all there was. The rest of the parade: absolutely fantastic ROTC units from Cornell, floats, scouts, many bagpipes and drum bands, color guards from other cities, etc., very few fire engines. This was a parade to celebrate with our veterans and that was very evident. The best part was listening to the mass formation of the bagpipe-drum bands back at the VFW. If you have never attended this you don't know what you are missing. If your ears can stand the loudness of the sound, you are in for a fantastic ½ hour of pure bliss. And so the Ithaca Veteran's Day parade was the best ever with more bagpipe bands than ever before.....Not to be out done by the Veteran's Day parade, Veteran's Day itself saw a lot of activity at DeWitt Park in Ithaca on the 11th hour of the 11th day of the 11th month. Tom Bennett, Phil Colvin, and George VanValen presented the colors, while Dave Boyd, Tony Chiesa, and Harold Wright shared the duties of the firing squad with 3 shooters from the Post in Dryden. Calvin Bailey was in attendance as were a number of SAL and auxiliary members. The program moved right along with several speakers making comments. It was a great tribute to our veterans. Following the ceremony, several of us stopped at the Ithaca VFW Post. It was but a short while before I was to speak to the Rotary Club regarding how and why Veterans Day came to be and how and why the American Legion was formed. I guess I was chosen to speak because of my role in the Legion as historian. If you read the Ithaca Journal on/or before Veterans Day you know that there were many articles explaining its inception and the changes it underwent between Armistice Day and Veterans Day. There were also a number of articles explaining how the formation of the American Legion came about and what functions it provided us with. Not realizing the Journal would be providing us with such in depth information, I set about going through the last 23 years of newsletters (276) during which I was editor and received phone calls telling me about the Ithaca Journal's veterans day info, all of which supplied a lot of data and answers to questions I expected would be asked. At about 7:30 p.m. when it was announced Rotary would be proceeding to their business meeting, I decided I

had answered their questions and said quite enough. When someone asked, "How did you do?" I'm not quite sure. Rotary; like the Legion, Elks, Masons, Odd Fellows, etc. seem to be experiencing difficulties bringing new, younger members to replace those that we are losing. Do you have any answers or solutions???. On Friday, November 12th our fish fry crew had the duty. One hundred forty-one dinners were served. A number of our crew was not able to be on board and people that are not normally used to taking orders were pressed into service. We hope those who attended were not disappointed with the result. We look forward to having you back again.....Recently I latched onto a Navy Times Newspaper which is apparently being left on the table in the entrance way to the bar lounge. Having been in the Navy for 5 years, I found a number of the articles extremely interesting. A few had to do with the increasing role of woman in the Navy. A copy of explanation of how to acquire this is described in a 7 page document published by the State of New Jersey's Senior News Notes. We have been informed that the State of New York and closer to home, Tompkins County, are behind the times when it comes to acquiring this document. A number of us from 770 and other posts participated in the Veterans issuing a photo I.D. card that took place at the Army Reserve on Warren Road some time ago. If you did not obtain your Veteran Photo I.D. card then, you will probably want to look into obtaining one now. Please contact our Commander or myself if you have any further information on the matter.....The Boy Scouts have planted a tree on our grounds in commemoration of 100 years of their existence. A fitting tribute to a fine organization.....For use of those who wish to use the kitchen without passing behind the bar, a "Key Pad" has been placed at the kitchen entry way. You must know the code to be able to enter the kitchen at this point.....New Legion Baseball pants have been purchased by the membership.....A monetary contribution was made to the Covert Veterans Memorial by the membership.....A number of electrical problems with everything from light bulbs, to parking lot lighting problems have cropped up. One by one they are being fixed (we hope).....We noticed the SAL pig roast in December was cancelled - Don't know why - just saw the sign on the door.....Although we were unable to attend the smorgasbord put on by Tom Bennett, Cindy and Gary Reckdenwald and others, we were impressed by the large crowd as one "peeked" in on this opening night of the winter festival. Everything looked so good and because the very cold weather it was a good place to be.....The Post membership would like to thank Doug and Denny Millsbaugh for their help in producing our American Legion sign on Route 96. They are always there to help.....Thanks to Jack Ellsworth for donating concrete blocks to be used in the construction of our BBQ pit. He has more for us to pick up when the weather changes.....So far this year, the Post is doing better financially with regard to dinners, fish fries, etc. than it did last year during the same time period; all except the bell jar receipts, they are below last years.....We have heard nothing but good reports regarding the military funeral conducted jointly by members of Post 770 and the Ovid V.F.W. for Tom Boyes. The Posts worked well together.....Henry VanNess is helping to coordinate the newsletter, (typing, etc.), since the loss of our typist.
