DID YOU KNOW?

SILVER STAR DAY – 5/1 OFFICIAL DAY – SILVER STARS JOIN BLUE AND GOLD

For more than 200 years, service members have made sacrifices for this country on the home front and abroad. The Auxiliary has been supporting those service members while they are away serving and when they return home for nearly the last 90 years. In 1918, the Women's Committee of the Council of National Defenses suggested that mothers who had lost a child in WWI wear a gold star to signify mourning. This led to the tradition of covering the blue star on service flags with gold if a service member was killed, or silver for those who were wounded. To provide a way to honor the wounded Steve Newton and his wife, Diana, founded Silver Star Families of American (SSFOA) in 2005. It is now part of the Department of Defense's America Supports You program. Newton served in the Marines during Vietnam and joined the Navy Reserves when he returned home. He is now a Legionnaire at Post 638 in Springfield, MO. He and his wife wanted a person way to honor those who shed blood for their country – and SSFOA was born. Nearly 1,000 soldiers have been honored with Silver Star Banners, but the names of many soldiers and sailors are on a waiting list. "There is nothing sadder than a wounded soldier on a waiting list for a banner," Newton said. "I want other units to visit SSFOA Website, become educated and incorporate this organization into a project for the Auxiliary." Eligibility for Silver Star Banners according to the SSFOA Web site: Any armed forces personnel either currently serving honorably or those who have served honorably from any way, who having served in a war zone has been wounded by enemy action or who has been injured or contracted a serious illness that could be rated at least 10 percent disabled by the Department of Veterans. This includes Affairs including Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder, Agent Orange and Gulf War Syndrome associated illnesses. Newton hopes that the Legion and Auxiliary will help support those service members who have been wounded. Newton's wife, Diana, added, "We want the Legion and Auxiliary to do the things they are already doing and incorporate us with their efforts. "We want to have the Legion family work with us to find the wounded, sponsor banners and visit VA hospitals," Newton said. "We never want to forget what these people sacrificed."
