POST NEWS

We begin our Post News at poolside here at sunny Anna Maria Island in Fl during a short winter get away. Our reason for getting a head start with our news letter is that the sun decided not to shine today and the wind on the beach is very strong... so what else to do.... Here goes. Our January 2nd of the month breakfast brought out 192 and our fish fry was 240. Those are great numbers and we rely on them to help pay our bills and our shortages. We do appreciate your patronage and look forward to serving you as best we know how. Although I believe our 3 fish fry crews are pretty much set for help, we could still use some more volunteers to work on our two monthly breakfasts. ... With Jan and Feb being rather lean months as far as activities are concerned let me assume, in abstention, that our Super Bowl and Dayton 500 dish-to-pass party's were a great success. We could have advertised them as one restaurant down here did, "Warm beer and small screen TV" at "Rotten Ralph's" ... but we don't falsely advertise. ... Let us take a moment to make clear a couple of things brought up at the last membership meeting. 1) The bar opens each day at 3 PM and closes at about 10 PM unless there are unforeseen circumstances or announced changes in these hours. 2) Kitchen and Banquet room use is \$100 for members and \$200 for non-members plus a \$50 clean up fee. These fees changes when outside caterers are used or when the Legion caters the event. When booking either the meeting room or the banquet room be sure you are informed of the exact cost and sign a contract to that affect. ... At this time the Pavilion Fund stands at about \$2,000. When Dave and Sandy Kline return we are sure they will have a lot of fund raising ideas to keep the amount climbing. ... I believe it would be of interest to everyone and so we will relate the highlights to you: Dear George, I thought I would let you know that Sue & I are invited by "The Friends of Saudi" to attend a banquet in Washington, DC on February 24 – 26th. They are sending flight tickets to us from Fort Myers to DC. We are being put up at the Marriot Hotel with everything paid for by the Saudi's. They have invited anyone that was on the DD 603 U.S.S. Murphy at the time of the Great Bitter Lake Conference (VALTA) between President Roosevelt, Stalin, Winston Churchill, and King Saud of Saudi, Arabia. Our destroyer escorted the cruiser U.S.S. Quincey that had Pres Roosevelt on board, and then we went through the Suez Canal to Jida, Arabia and picked up the King and took him to the conference. We on the Murphy didn't realize it at the time but that is when Pres Roosevelt made the deal to develop Saudi Oil. It is now considered a very historic meeting" ... And now you

The Albert M. Becker Memorial Scholarship 2006 is an annual \$1,000 cash scholarship in the memory of Albert Becker, Past NYALPA President and Past Department Commander. Each applicant must be a child of a member of the Legion or Auxiliary and pursuing a degree in the field of Communications. An original 500-word essay explaining why they have chosen Communications, as a future vocation must be submitted with proof of eligibility, acceptance at an approved

college, proof of college major, and a high school transcript with the applications. They must be received by May 15th, 2006 at the following address: Scholarship Chairman, NYALPA, PO Box 650, East Aurora, NY 14052. Application forms are available at the bulletin board in the Post 770 lounge. Scholarships will be awarded at the Annual Meeting of the NYALPA Association on July 21, 2006 at 1:00 PM in Rochester, NY. The recipient will be expected to accept the award in person unless excused by the committee.
