LETTER TO THE EDITOR

This is a short letter to inform American Legion Members and those connected with the military in any way, of conditions at some of our larger military bases. Our son, Anthony DeFranco, stationed at Fort Bragg, has been robbed of valuables twice within a 3-month period. When they burglarized his home the last time they cut all outside electrical connections before entering and making off with a number of valuables. It appears they have knowledge of the status of military personnel assignments. Prime targets are those who have been or about to be shipped out to Iraq, leaving their houses empty. Local police are not able to stay on top of this situation because of the vast number of military personnel residing in the area. Although the American Legion is not in a position to do anything in this situation, we can at least make sure military personnel are aware of what is going on and take steps to be sure that valuables are secured or put into a safe deposit box. DID YOU KNOW?

THE POW/MIA FLAG: In 1971, Mrs. Michael Hoff, the wife of a US military officer listed as missing in action during the Vietnam War, developed the idea for a national flag to remind every American of the US service members whose fates were never accounted for during the war. Newt Heisley, a former World War II pilot, designed the black and white image of a gaunt silhouette, a strand of barbed wire, and an ominous watchtower. Some claim the silhouette is a profile of Heisley's son, who contracted hepatitis while training to go to Vietnam. The virus ravaged his body, leaving his features hollow and emancipated. They suggest that while staring at his son's sunken features, Heilsey saw the stark image of American service members held captive as Prisoners of War.

"VETS TO GET A BOOST FROM BLOCK PARTY" by Pamela Goddard: "Support Our Troops". This phrase means different things to different people, but, in spite of personal views, providing veterans with access to adequate health care is something everyone can agree on. The Danby American Legion Post 221 is doing its part with a fundraiser for the Ithaca Van Shuttle Service, which provides transportation to the Syracuse VA Hospital. Legion Post 221 is hosting the sixth annual Community Block party on Saturday August 16th at the VFW headquarters, Route 96B. Food, music, raffles, a horseshoe tournament and an auction all support a growing need. "They run a van two or three times a week from Ithaca to the Syracuse hospital, taking vets up there," says Lynn Cism, past Commander of Post 221. "Half of everything we raise will go to the VA hospital and the other half for van support. Maintenance, gas, and so on."

SUICIDE HOTLINE FOR VETS GOT 22,000 CALLS IN FIRST YEAR: by **Katharine Euphrat:** More than 22,000 veterans have sought help from a special suicide hot line in its first year, and 1,221 suicides have been averted, the government says. According to a recent RAND Corp. study, roughly one in five soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan displays symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder, putting them at a high risk for suicide. Researchers at Portland State University found that male veterans are twice as likely to commit suicide than men who are not veterans. This month, a former Army medic, Joseph Dwyer, who was shown in a Military Times photograph running through a battle zone carrying an Iraqi boy, died of an accidental overdose after struggling with post-traumatic stress disorder for almost 5 years. Janet Kemp, national suicide prevention coordinator for the Veterans Affairs Department, said the hot line is in place to help prevent deaths such as Dwyer's. "We just want them to know there's other options and people do care about them, and we can help them make a difference in their lives," she said in an interview. The VA teamed up with the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration to launch the hot line last July after years of criticism that the VA wasn't doing enough to help wounded soldiers returning from Iraq and Afghanistan. The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is available 24 hours a day by calling 800-273-TALK (8255); veterans should press "1" after being connected.
